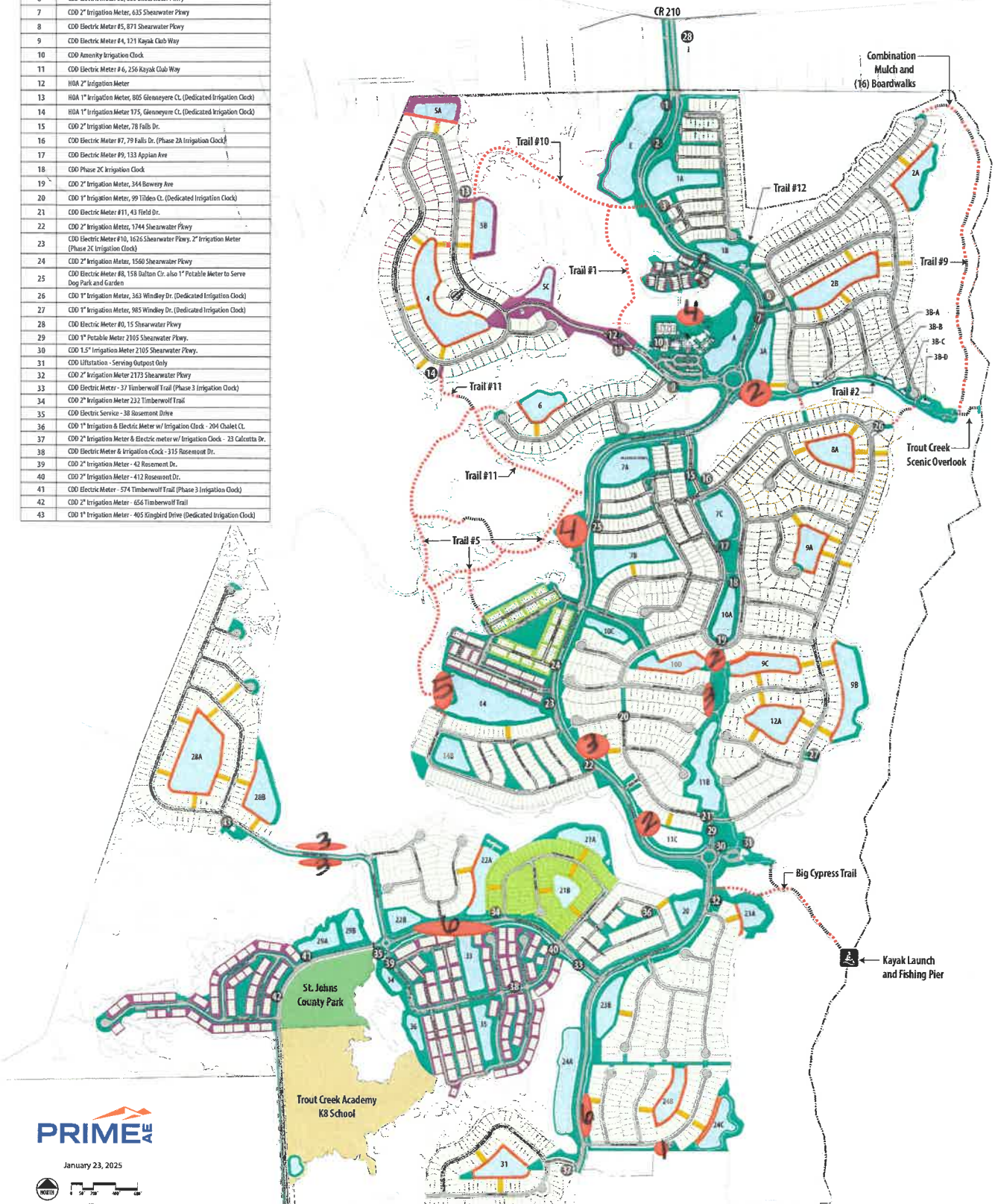

MEMORANDUM

Subject: Florida Open Carry Updates

On Monday, September 15, 2025, Attorney General James Uthmeier released a guidance memorandum on Florida's Open Carry Laws following the First District Court of Appeals holding in *McDaniels v. State*, 345 So. 3d 1025 (Fla. 1st DCA 2025) that Florida's ban on "open carry" is unconstitutional. The Attorney General has noted that, pursuant to Florida's judicial precedent, this First District Court of Appeals decision is binding on all Florida trial courts unless and until another District Court of Appeal or the Florida Supreme Court rules differently. As such, law enforcement personnel have been instructed to "refrain from arresting or prosecuting law-abiding citizens carrying a firearm in a manner that is visible to others." It is important to note that this decision does not prevent law enforcement from continuing to police individuals who exhibit firearms in a "rude, careless, angry, or threatening manner" or in a prohibited location under state or federal law. This memorandum provides guidance to special districts regarding the management of situations involving both residents and non-residents carrying firearms (either openly or concealed) on district property, subject to applicable state and federal laws.

As a result of the court ruling in *McDaniels*, the state of the law on open carry is uncertain. The prohibition on open carry was deemed unconstitutional by the *McDaniels* court, but until action by the Legislature or further guidance from the courts, we are left without meaningful guidance on restrictions or requirements for open carry. However, existing laws regarding requirements for concealed carry are instructive.

Individuals Authorized to Concealed Carry

Currently, under Chapter 790, *Florida Statutes*, an individual who does not hold a license to carry a concealed firearm must still comply with statutory eligibility requirements as if they were a licensee. Under section 790.01(1), *Florida Statutes*, any unlicensed individual carrying a concealed firearm must "satisfy the criteria for receiving and maintaining such a license under section 790.06(2)(a)-(f) and (i)-(n), (3), and (10), Florida Statutes." The statutory criteria establish mandatory requirements, including but not limited to: (1) being a United States citizen or holding certain other legal residence status; (2) being at least 21 years of age, or at least 18 years of age and a service member (including active members of the United States Armed Forces, Florida National Guard, and U.S. Reserve Forces) or honorably discharged veteran; (3) not suffering from a physical infirmity preventing the safe handling of a firearm; (4) not having certain substance abuse issues; and (5) not having the criminal or mental health record described in section

790.06(2), *Florida Statutes*. Additionally, pursuant to section 790.013, *Florida Statutes*, any person carrying a concealed firearm without a license must carry valid identification and comply with the statutory restrictions prohibiting carrying firearms (openly or concealed) in certain locations.

Open Carry Limitations

As the court stated in *McDaniels*, and as the Attorney General reiterated, allowing open carry in Florida does not impact the locations in which carrying – open or concealed – is prohibited or the behaviors that are prohibited while carrying a firearm. While section 790.06(12)(a), *Florida Statutes*, outlines multiple places where firearms are prohibited, those most relevant to special districts include: (1) schools; (2) polling places; (3) any meeting of the governing body of certain local governments, including special districts; (4) any portion of an establishment licensed to dispense alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises, which portion of the establishment is primarily devoted to such purpose; (5) any school, college, or professional athletic event; or (6) any location prohibited by federal law. Furthermore, in accordance with section 790.10, *Florida Statutes*, individuals may not exhibit a firearm in a rude, careless, angry, or threatening manner, except when necessary for self-defense.

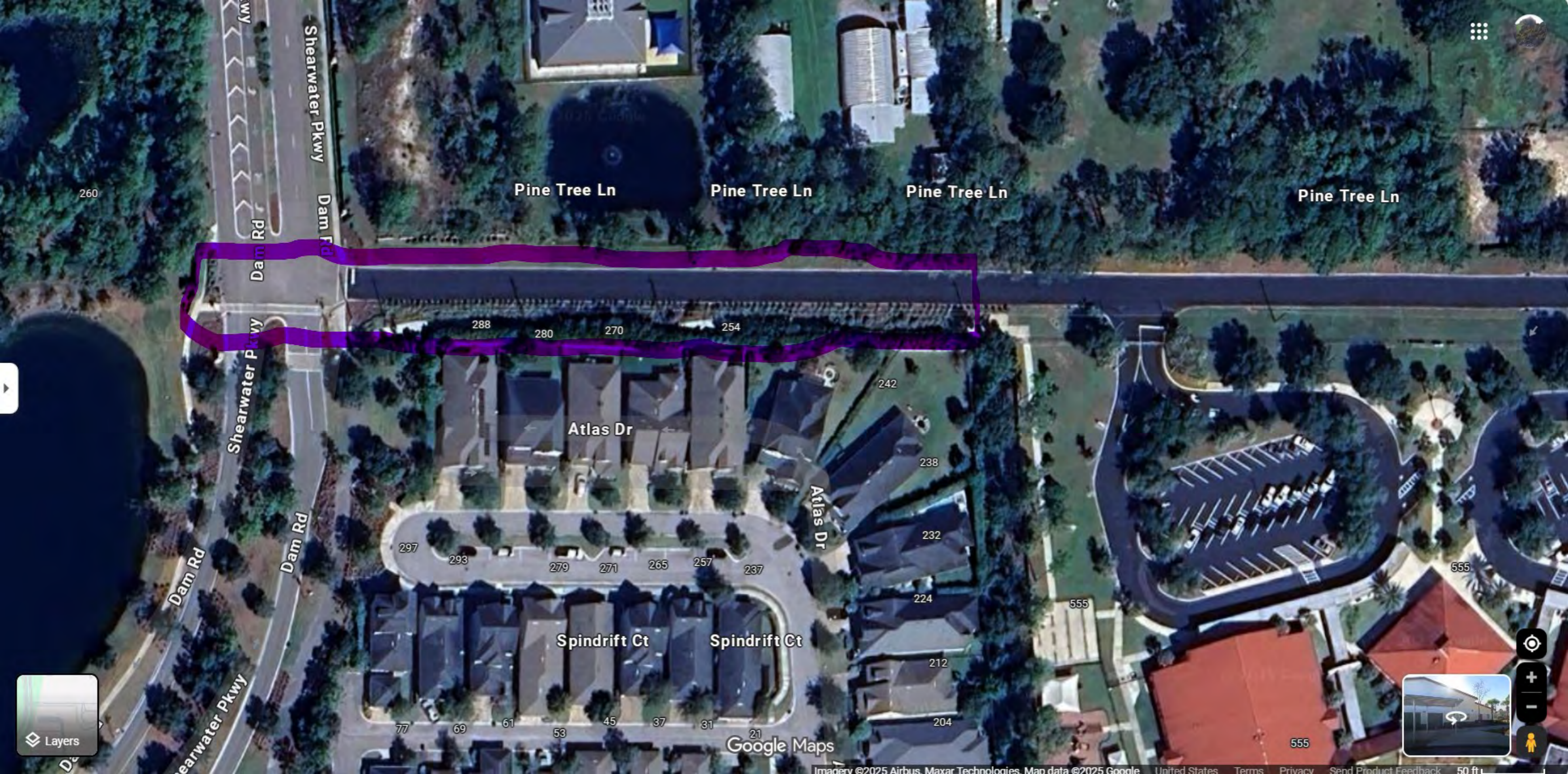
Recommended Actions for District Staff

District staff should anticipate interactions with individuals exercising their open-carry rights as established under the *McDaniels* decision and should respond in accordance with this guidance. As mentioned, the state of the law is in limbo at this time, and this guidance draws on other local government guidance and consultation with Sheriff's offices across the state. It is important for district staff to act within the parameters of the law as it stands today, and as it may evolve in the future.

- *Age Minimum*: In the event an individual open carries into a district facility, onsite district staff may request, but cannot require, identification to determine if the individual is at least 21 years of age (or 18 for qualifying military members/veterans), as there is no statutory requirement for individuals to present identification upon request by district staff. If it is determined that the individual is not at least 21 years old, district staff should call law enforcement.
- *Brandishing a Weapon*: If the individual exhibits objectively observable behavior that constitutes handling the firearm in a rude, careless, angry, or threatening manner as described in section 790.10, *Florida Statutes*, district staff should promptly contact law enforcement while maintaining a safe distance and documenting the specific behaviors observed in an incident report. Such prohibited behavior includes, but is not limited to, pointing the firearm at any person, brandishing the weapon, or using it in a manner that could reasonably be interpreted as intimidating.
- *Board Meeting/Workshop*: As stated previously, in accordance with section 790.06(12)(a), *Florida Statutes*, individuals are prohibited from carrying a firearm, openly or concealed, to any meeting of a special district's board of supervisors. If this occurs, district staff should

immediately contact law enforcement and document the incident in accordance with district policies and procedures and consider recessing the meeting.

- *Premises Licensed by DBPR for Alcohol Sales:* If a special district has a restaurant, café, or other establishment that is licensed to sell alcohol, no person may possess a firearm in any portion of the facility primarily dedicated to serving alcoholic beverages for consumption on premises (i.e., staff should verify the specific areas designated as licensed premises for alcohol consumption. Depending on the situation, on-site district staff may first request that any person in possession of a firearm leave the prohibited area. If the person refuses to comply, or in instances where the individual is acting in an aggressive or other concerning manner, staff should immediately contact law enforcement for assistance and document the incident.
- *Within 1000 Feet of a School:* Please note that these changes do not impact the prohibition on an unlicensed individual carrying a firearm within 1,000 feet of a public, private, or parochial school, as outlined in the Federal Gun Free School Zones Act of 1990. *See* Section 790.06(12)(a), *Florida Statutes*, and 18 U.S.C. § 922(q), including exceptions. If your district includes a school within its boundary, consult with your KVV lawyer regarding legal considerations on this prohibition.

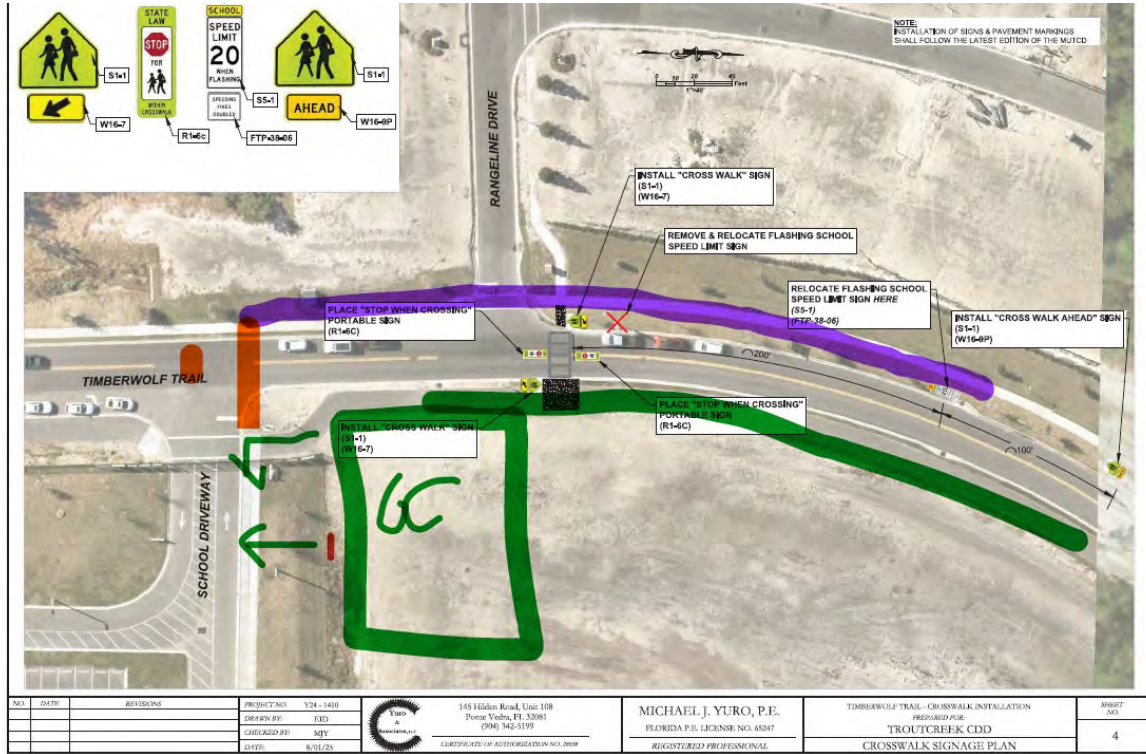

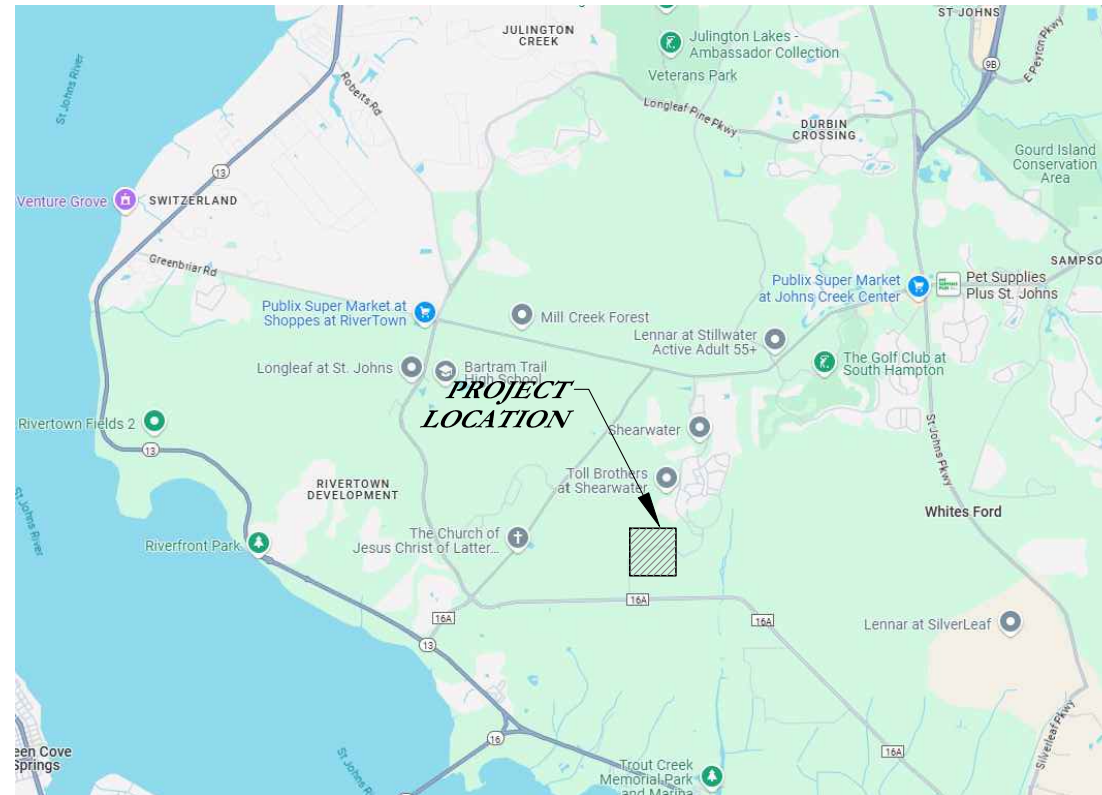

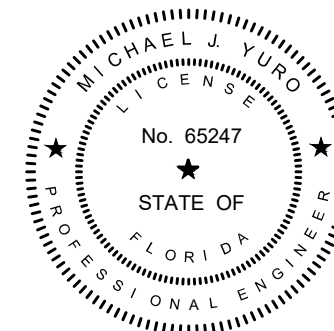

SITE PREPARATION NOTES:

NORMAL, GOOD PRACTICE SITE PREPARATION PROCEDURES SHALL BE USED FOR THIS PROJECT. THESE PROCEDURES INCLUDE: STRIPPING THE SITE OF EXISTING VEGETATION AND TOPSOIL, COMPACTING THE SUBGRADE AND PLACING NECESSARY FILL OR BACK FILL TO GRADE WITH ENGINEERED FILL. A MORE DETAILED SYNOPSIS OF THIS WORK IS AS FOLLOWS:

1. PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION, THE LOCATION OF ANY EXISTING UNDERGROUND UTILITY LINES WITHIN THE CONSTRUCTION AREA SHOULD BE ESTABLISHED. PROVISIONS SHOULD THEN BE MADE TO RELOCATE INTERFERING UTILITIES TO APPROPRIATE LOCATIONS. ABANDONED PIPES SHALL BE PROPERLY REMOVED OR PLUGGED, AS THEY MAY SERVE AS CONDUITS FOR SUB-SURFACE EROSION WHICH MAY SUBSEQUENTLY LEAD TO EXCESSIVE SETTLEMENT OF OVERLAY STRUCTURE(S).
2. IT IS RECOMMENDED THE TOP OF THE CLAYEY SANDS BE MAINTAINED A MINIMUM OF 2 FEET BELOW THE PROPOSED BOTTOM OF THE BASE MATERIAL OR CONCRETE PAVEMENT. COMPACT THE SUBGRADE FROM THE SURFACE WITH A LIGHT WEIGHT VIBRATORY ROLLER (A 2 TO 3 TON ROLLER, STATIC WEIGHT AND 3 FOOT DRUM DIAMETER) OR TRACKED DOZER EQUIPMENT UNTIL A MINIMUM DENSITY OF AT LEAST 98 PERCENT OF THE MODIFIED PROCTOR MAXIMUM DRY DENSITY (ASTM D-1557), TO A DEPTH OF 12 INCHES BELOW THE COMPACTED SURFACE IS OBTAINED. A MINIMUM OF EIGHT (8) COMPLETE COVERAGES SHOULD BE MADE IN THE PAVEMENT CONSTRUCTION AREA WITH A ROLLER TO IMPROVE THE UNIFORMITY AND INCREASE THE DENSITY OF THE UNDERLYING SANDY SOILS. THE USE OF HEAVY VIBRATORY COMPACTION EQUIPMENT SHALL NOT BE UTILIZED DUE TO THE POTENTIAL FOR PUMPING OF THE NEAR CLAYEY SOILS ENCOUNTERED, UNLESS APPROVED BY THE ENGINEER.

SHOULD THE SUBGRADE SOILS EXPERIENCE PUMPING AND SOIL STRENGTH LOSS DURING THE COMPACTION OPERATIONS, COMPACTION WORK SHOULD BE IMMEDIATELY TERMINATED AND (1) THE DISTURBED SOILS REMOVED AND BACKFILLED WITH DRY STRUCTURAL FILL SOILS WHICH ARE THEN COMPACTED, OR (2) THE EXCESS PORE PRESSURES WITHIN THE DISTURBED SOILS ALLOWED TO DISSIPATE BEFORE RECOMPACTING.

TO AVOID PUMPING OF THE UNDERPLAYING CLAYEY SOILS, SELF PROPELLED VIBRATING EQUIPMENT SHALL REMAIN A MINIMUM OF 2 FEET ABOVE THE CLAYEY SOILS. THE SANDY SOILS WITHIN 2 FEET OF THE CLAYEY SOILS MAY BE COMPACTED WITH A VIBRATORY ROLLER.


OPERATE IN THE STATIC MODE OR WITH A TRACK DOZER TO AVOID DISTURBING THE CLAYEY SOILS. A MINIMUM OF 18 INCHES OF SAND SHALL OVERLAY THE CLAYEY SOILS PRIOR TO OPERATION OF ANY TYPE OF CONSTRUCTION EQUIPMENT. EXCESS DISTURBANCE OF THE CLAYEY SOILS WILL DEGRADE THE STRENGTH CHARACTERISTICS OF THE SOIL AND MAY RESULT IN AN UNSUITABLE SOIL WHICH WILL REQUIRE OVER AND SUBSEQUENT BACKFILLING WITH CLEAN FINE SAND FILL MATERIAL. 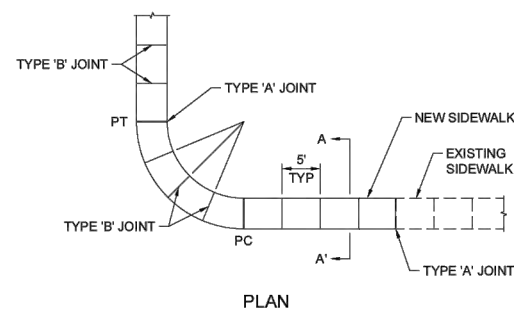
TYPICAL PAVEMENT SECTION - LOCAL ROAD

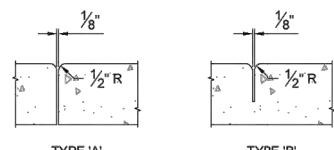


CURB RAMP

Below is the landscape maintenance report for Trout Creek CDD Ph 1.

Weekly Maintenance

Maintenance crew is focused on completing our weekly maintenance program within ph1. Our detail personal has been busy preforming weekly weed control within plant beds, removing fallen limbs from tree canopies, removing vine that exposes through plant materials.

We engaged our detail crew this month to perform selective pruning within all plant bed areas along Shearwater Parkway in ph1. This project has been needed for years and we wanted to tackle it first hand with no charge to the community. Our team performed an extremely aggressive, precise project that consisted a 2 week pre planning operation to navigate logistically through SWPKY, identify each section on plant/tree material and what was to be done. This plan resulted in Live Oaks having all moss/dead wood removed, and canopies raised. The Oaks were internally climbed and hand pruned to achieve this. Now in Oct.2025 the Oaks are already flushing new growth and looking much better overall. Beyond the Oak trimming our team cut back overgrown Southern Wax Myrtles along SWPKY that were chocking out Southern Azlea's and Patio Ligustrums. The biggest find was the Patio Ligustrums on top of the wall in the center island where the Shearwater sign is inline with the waterfalls. At the end of it all, SWPKY from cr210 to the roundabout at the Amenity has been completely reformed and brough new life to material that was talked about needing replacement. We are looking forward to the 2026 season where we will see remarkable results throughout ph1 due to this project.

Irrigation

From a mechanical stand point the ph1 irrigation system is fully operational. Our team has repaired all vales that were not operating properly and uncovered all valve boxes (most were buried up to 12" in dirt/leaf debris). Currently we have all turf zones operating on battery timers, and will be holding on repairing the 2wire until the entry construction is complete. There are far to may zones that are affected by the construction area to bring the 2wire path online. Bringing the path online will only cause more issues each time the 2wire is compromised by construction.

Agronomics

Fert/chem has completed all turf fertilization, post weed applications, and pre-m in all turf/shrub areas within ph1. Our team manually water the turf zones after fertilization was applied. Please see attached reports.

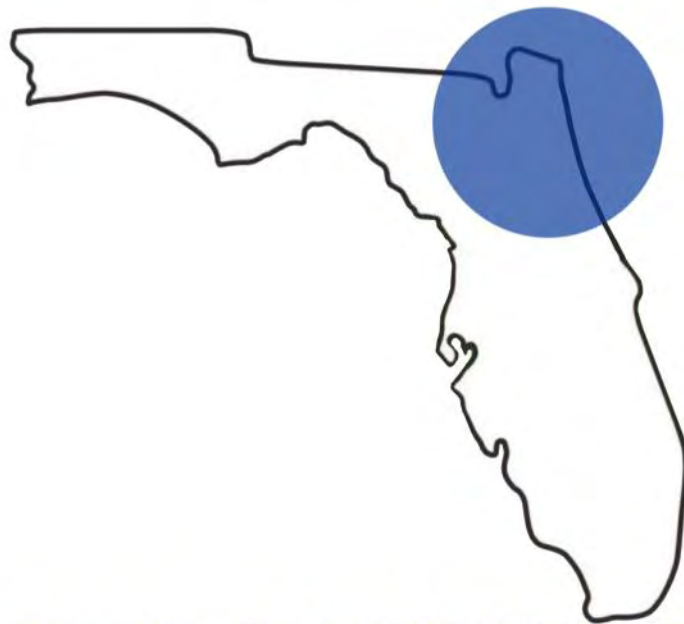

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the District and The Tree Amigos Outdoor Services LLC (“**Predecessor**”) previously entered into that certain *Trout Creek Community Development District Landscape & Irrigation Maintenance Services Agreement* dated February 1, 2024 (the “**Agreement**”), incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, after the Agreement was executed, Predecessor, Contractor, and District executed that certain *Consent to Assignment of the Agreement for Landscape & Irrigation Maintenance Services by and between Trout Creek Community Development District and the Tree Amigos Outdoor Services, LLC, to Ruppert Landscape, LLC*, dated October 31, 2024, wherein Contractor assumed all of Predecessor’s rights, duties, and obligations under the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Parties now desire to amend the Agreement to reduce the service area included in the Maintenance Maps/Plans, defined in and attached as Exhibit C to the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 8(h) of the Agreement, the Agreement may be amended by an instrument in writing executed by the Parties; and

WHEREAS, the District and Contractor each represent that it has the authority to execute this Amendment and to perform its obligations and duties hereunder, and each has satisfied all conditions precedent to the execution of this Amendment so that this Amendment constitutes a legal and binding obligation of each party hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, based upon good and valuable consideration and the mutual covenants of the Parties, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS. The recitals stated above are true and correct and by this reference are incorporated herein and form a material part of this Amendment.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT. Pursuant to Section 8(h) of the Agreement, the Parties agree to amend the Agreement in the following manner:

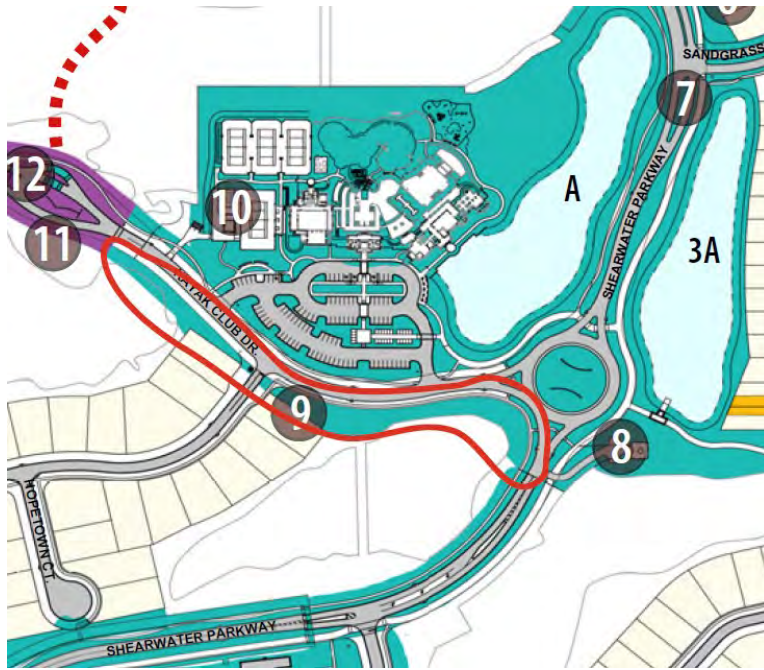

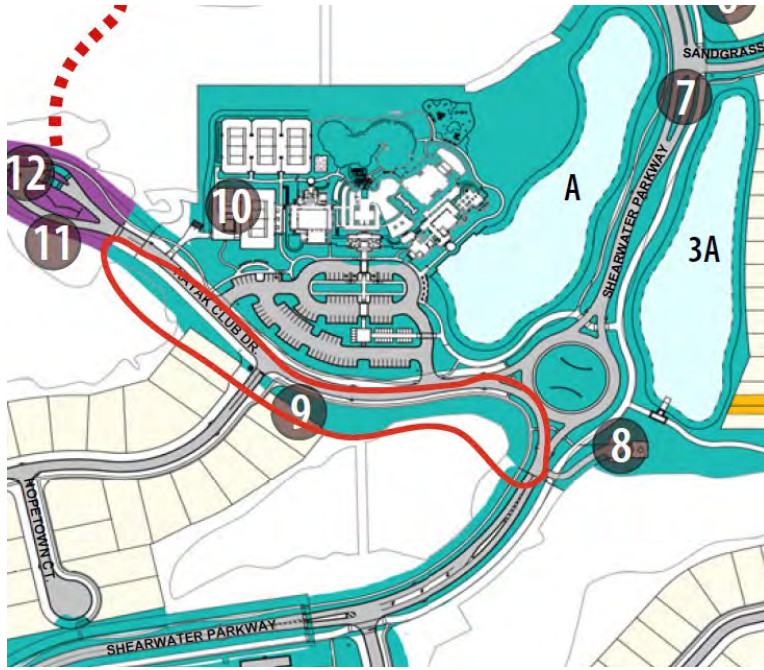

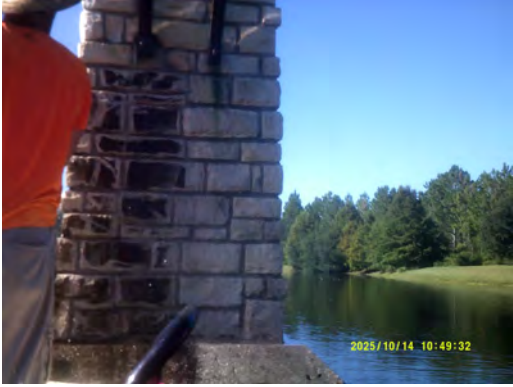

September 10th – Coffee and Conversations – The Post Law Firm

- ✓ Great presentation. Attendance of about 48 people throughout the event. Sponsors had quite a few good leads and are interested in participating again in the future.

September 13th - Real Estate Home Buyer workshop – United Real Estate Gallery

- ✓ 2 resident realtors sponsored and hosted the event. Light breakfast was provided. They brought in 3 additional speakers who presented basic info. 10 attendees throughout but the sponsors were very happy with the turnout and response.

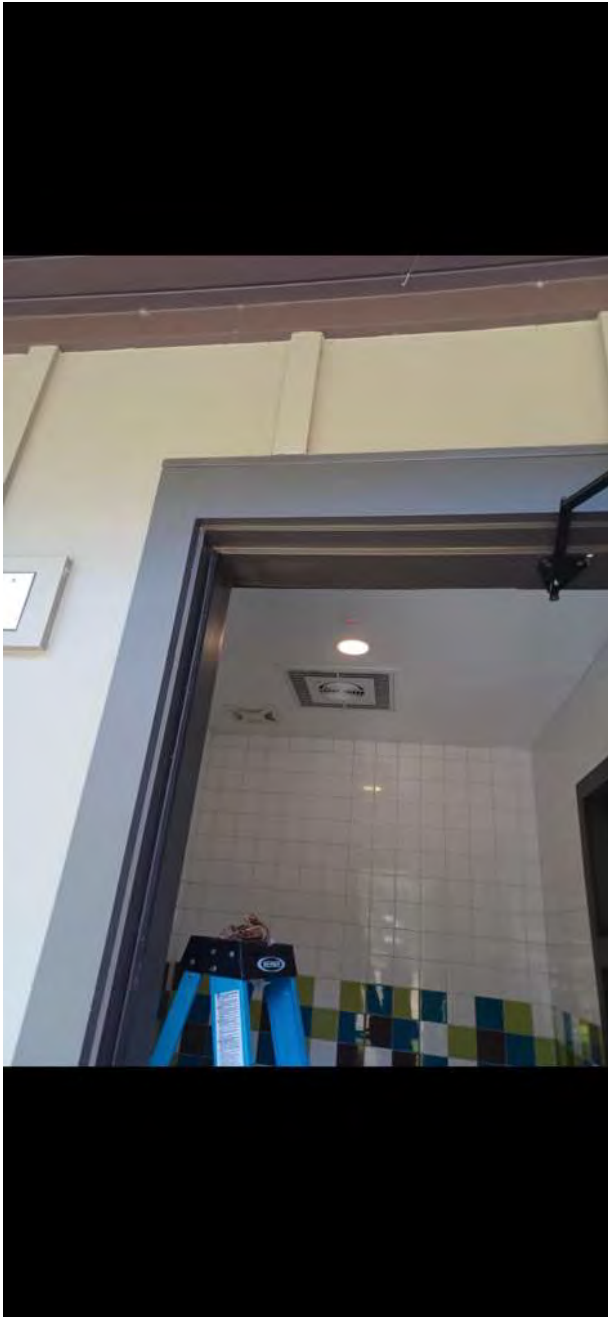

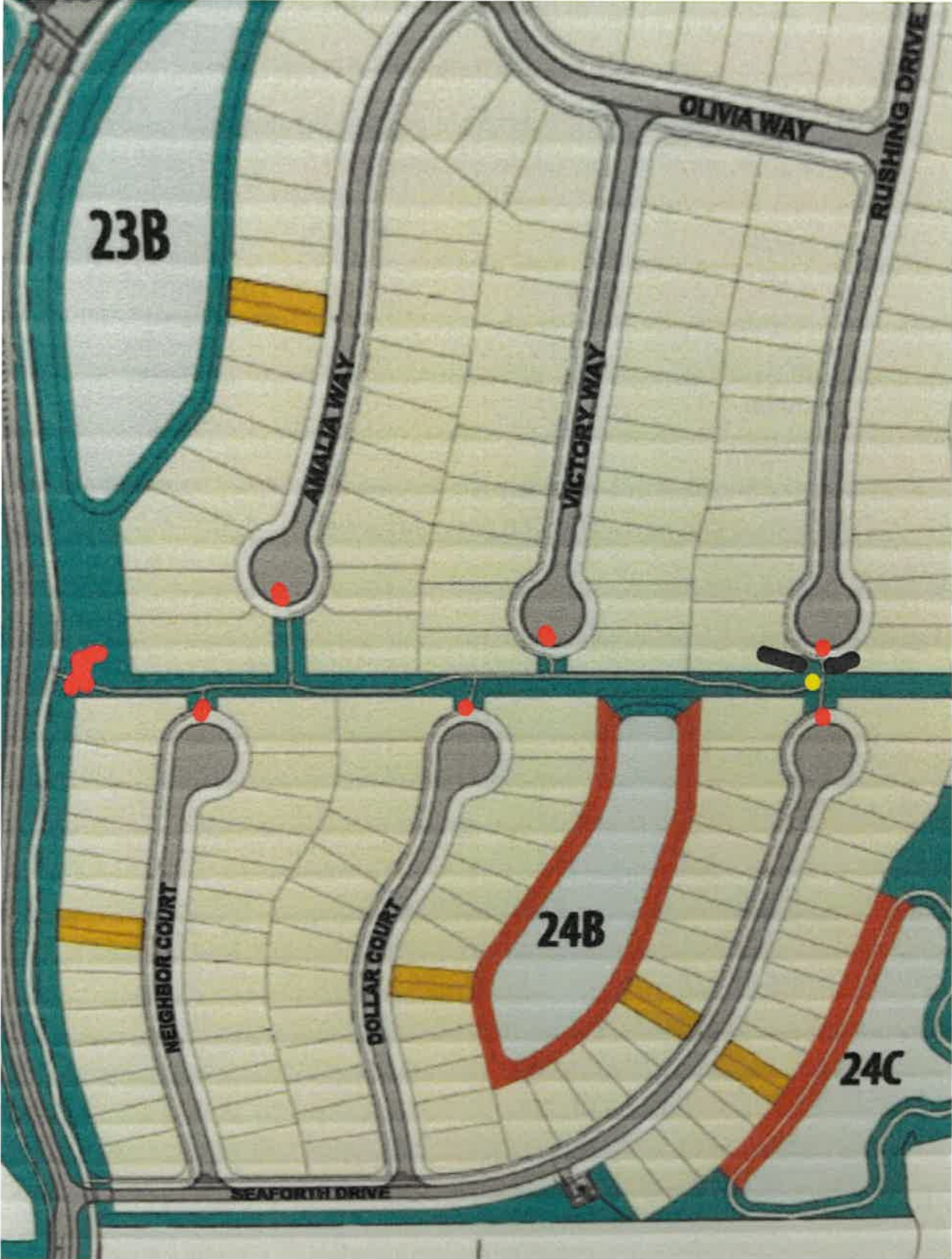

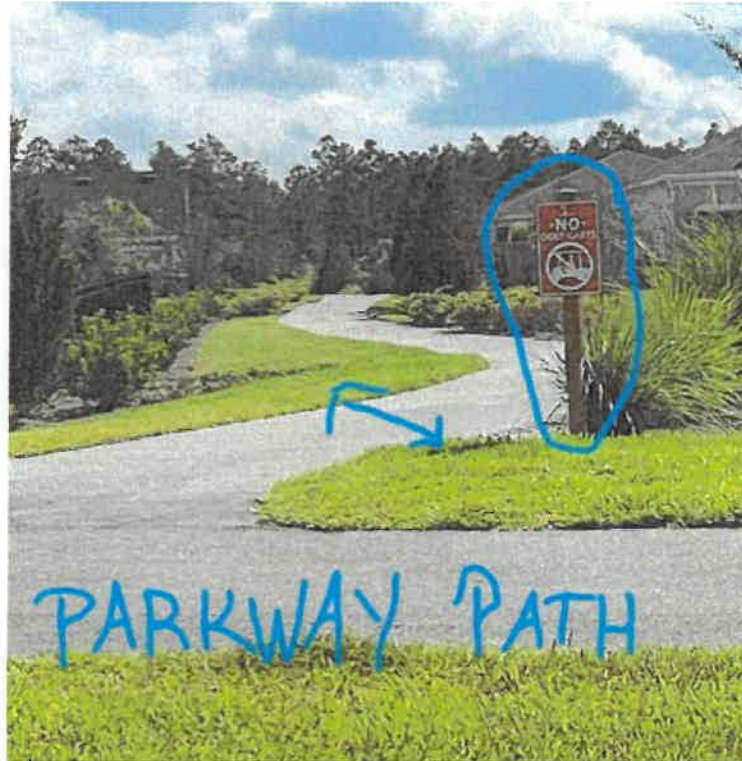

WHEREAS, after review and consideration of the proposals received by the District, the Board determined to award ___ points to **Oak Wells Aquatics, Inc.** and ___ points to **C BUSS ENTERPRISES, INC.** based upon the evaluation criteria found in the RFP; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby determines its intent to award the contract for Services to Oak Wells Aquatics, Inc. / C BUSS ENTERPRISES, INC. (circle one) (“**Awardee**”) as the most responsive, responsible proposer in accordance with the terms of the RFP.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE TROUT CREEK COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. All of the representations, findings and determinations contained within the recitals stated above are recognized as true and accurate and are expressly incorporated into this Resolution.

SECTION 2. The response of Awardee is the response which is the most responsive and responsible and which best serves the interests of the District.

SECTION 3. It is the intent of the District’s Board to award Awardee a contract for the Services in accordance with the terms and conditions of the RFP.

SECTION 4. Notice of this award shall be given to all proposers in accordance with the District’s Rules of Procedure and the Project Manual. The District’s Chairperson and Vice Chairperson, members of the Board and staff of the District are hereby authorized to take such further actions as are necessary to ensure the expeditious execution of a contract for the Services.

SECTION 5. If any provision of this Resolution is held to be illegal or invalid, the other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. This Resolution shall become effective upon its passage and shall remain in effect unless rescinded or repealed.

RESOLUTION 2026-02

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE TROUT CREEK COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS; WAIVING A PORTION OF RULE 1.3(1), RULES OF PROCEDURE; PROVIDING FOR REASONABLE NOTICE OF BOARD MEETINGS; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Trout Creek Community Development District (the “District”) is a local unit of special-purpose government created and existing pursuant to Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*, being situated entirely within St. Johns County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the District’s Board of Supervisors (“Board”) holds public meetings, hearings, and workshops (together, “meetings”) for the purpose of conducting District business; and

WHEREAS, Section 189.015, *Florida Statutes*, requires that the District file quarterly, semiannually, or annually a schedule of its regular meetings with the local governing authority or authorities, and publish said notice in accordance with statutory requirements, and such regularly scheduled meetings are required to be listed on the District’s website by Section 189.069(2)(a), *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, Section 286.011(1), *Florida Statutes*, requires the District to provide reasonable notice of all meetings of its Board; and

WHEREAS, the District previously adopted Rule 1.3(1) of its Rules of Procedure providing, among other things, that “Except in emergencies, or as otherwise required by statute or these Rules, at least seven (7) days, but no more than thirty (30) days public notice shall be given of any public meeting, hearing or workshop of the Board,” and that “Public notice shall be given by publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the District and in the county in which the District is located”; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that providing the published notice required by Section 189.015, *Florida Statutes*, together with posting meeting dates, times, and locations on the District’s website, constitutes reasonable notice for purposes of Section 286.011(1), *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the Board accordingly finds that it is in the District’s best interests to waive the requirement of Rule 1.3(1) that published notice of meetings may not be published more than thirty (30) days before the meeting, and to set forth alternative minimum standards for reasonable notice of Board meetings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TROUT CREEK COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. RECITALS. The above stated recitals are true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. FINDINGS. The Board hereby finds providing the published notice required by Section 189.015, *Florida Statutes*, together with posting meeting dates, times, and locations on the District’s website, constitutes reasonable notice for purposes of Section 286.011(1), *Florida Statutes*.

SECTION 3. WAIVER. The Board hereby waives the provision of Rule 1.3(1) of the District’s Rules of Procedure that the required published notice of meetings may not be published more than thirty (30) days before the meeting. Publication of the quarterly, semiannual, or annual meeting notice as required by Section 189.015, *Florida Statutes*, is deemed to satisfy the requirement for published notice in Rule 1.3(1) of the District’s Rules of Procedure for those meetings included in the quarterly, semiannual, or annual notice. This Resolution does not supersede any requirements of the Florida Statutes as to additional published notice required for any meeting or hearing of the District.

SECTION 4. REASONABLE NOTICE.

- A. **Regular meetings.** The District Manager is directed to (a) file quarterly, semiannually, or annually a schedule of its regular meetings with the local governing authority or authorities, and publish said notice in accordance with statutory requirements; (b) post the date, time, and location of all regular meetings on the District’s website at least seven (7) days prior to each meeting; and (c) take any other actions as are reasonable under the circumstances to provide notice of meetings.
- B. **Special meetings.** For any special meeting, emergency meeting, or other meeting not included in the quarterly, semiannual, or annual notice, the District Manager is directed to (a) publish an additional notice at least seven (7) days before said meeting in the manner specified in Rule 1.3(1), and (b) post the date, time, and location on the District’s website at least seven (7) days prior to each meeting, and (c) take any other actions as are reasonable under the circumstances to provide notice of meetings.
- C. **Statutorily required notice.** Where the Florida Statutes require published notice of certain meetings or hearings, including but not limited to budget hearings, assessment hearings, rulemaking hearings, and others, the District Manager is directed to strictly comply with such requirements.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Resolution is held to be illegal or invalid, the other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall become effective upon its passage and shall remain in effect unless rescinded or repealed.

Mr. Yuro reviewed that he has reached out to six contractors in total and has the proposal from the last meeting in the amount of \$40,425.00. One contractor has declined to bid and he is waiting on proposals from the others.

3.) Discussion Regarding Use of Paths

Discussion ensued as to what would be required to make the community a designated golf cart community and if sidewalk widening would require County approval and permits. Mr. Yuro will investigate the requirements further with the County.

Mr. Yuro then noted that he will be confirming the punch list items are completed with the Goodhope project before any retainage is released. Mr. Yuro was also requested to attend the meeting with Commissioner Arnold tomorrow afternoon at 3:30 p.m.

The Board continued to the Landscape Maintenance Report on the agenda.

The Board had no comments.

C. Pond Aquatics Service Reports

The Board had no comments.

D. General Manager Report**1.) Survey Update**

Ms. Tharpe noted that the survey is being reworked and will be resent by mail and will include a QR code as part of this.

Ms. Knutelsky provided a presentation of the First Service Residential Year In Review.

The Board moved back to the District Counsel Report.

E. District Counsel**1.) Consideration of Besch and Smith Enforcement Update**

Ms. Kilinski reviewed her recommendation of a 558 Construction Defect Notice being sent to Besch and Smith and Mr. Yuro providing a post construction review. It was also noted that her firm would work on the repair contract should Besch and Smith if they do not respond by the timeline provided.

2.) Requests from School District

Ms. Kilinski reviewed that a request had been received from the Deputy Sheriff who is a Youth Resource Officer at Timberlin Creek Elementary. The first part of the request was to have the District grant authorization to the Deputy grant trespass enforcement along a specific area of CDD property that is adjacent to the school in response to the recently

149 passed open carry legislation. The second part of the request would allow the use of a
150 specific area of CDD property to provide an evacuation path from the school in the
151 event of an emergency. Discussion ensued regarding impacts of the open carry law, if
152 both schools in the district would have the same request, the entity that would be
153 responsible for installation, maintenance and upkeep of the evacuation path and any
154 liability for the district. The board would discuss the trespass authorization further at
155 their next workshop but in discussion felt that the use of CDD property to have a safe
156 evacuation path in the event of an emergency with no liability to the district could be
157 approved subject to the District Engineer reviewing the plans of the evacuation route
158 and subject to the school being responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of the path
159 and ramp.
